

Dependence Forming Medications - High quality e-learning courses from PrescQIPP



This e-learning course designed for medicines management teams, GPs, practice nurses, practice pharmacists and non-medical prescribers covers the statistics around the use of dependence forming medications, including modules on opioids, benzodiazepines & z-drugs and gabapentin & pregabalin. It offers practical advice regarding the initiation of these medicines and how long-term use can be reviewed and managed.

The learning from the course is supported by four case studies and advice from two GPs with a special interest in this area.

Course content
