

## Ivabradine in chronic stable angina

Prescribing guidance for GPs

Indications:

BNF: Ivabradine is licensed for the treatment of stable angina in patients in sinus rhythm. It is also licensed for the treatment of mild to severe chronic heart failure.


## Unique benefits:

Ivabradine may be particularly beneficial in patients with heart failure or angina who cannot tolerate other drugs due to hypotension, as Ivabradine rarely affects the blood pressure.

## Tolerability:

Ivabradine is generally well tolerated. Common side effects include temporary brightness in the field of vision, headaches, tiredness and atrioventricular block.

## How Ivabradine fits into the management of stable angina (based on NICE CG126 Stable Angina):



<sup>1.</sup>Add a third drug only when:

Symptoms are not controlled with two anti-anginals and

• The patient is awaiting revascularisation, or revascularisation is not appropriate
