Medicine Supply Notification

Tuberculosis (TB) oral agents

Tier 2 – medium impact*

Date of issue: 23 March 2020

Summary

- Since August 2019 a number of oral TB agents have been impacted by supply issues.
- Please see the table in the 'Supporting Information' section for the latest stock positions, suggested management plans and anticipated dates for re-supply.

Actions Required

Pharmacy procurement, clinical teams (including prescribers, TB nurses and clinicians) and any outsourced partners should work together to ensure that:

- stock holding of TB agents is reviewed regularly;
- alternatives, as advised in the summary table, are ordered for the products that are in short supply;
- prescriptions are amended in cases where the usual/preferred product is unavailable so that treatment is not delayed or interrupted;
- Trusts do not implement management plans that are not in line with the advice given within this document as that may precipitate further out of stock periods;
- patients are appropriately counselled about changes to their usual/expected medication; and
- if products that have not been flagged as out of stock cannot be obtained, this is escalated to your Regional Pharmacy Procurement Specialist (see below for contact details).
