

## Inhaler Switch options for ASTHMA in adults (> 18yrs only)

Seretide 250 Accuhaler 1 puff twice a day or (equivalent to 1000mcg BDP/day) Seretide (or Sirdupla ) 125 MDI 2 puffs twice a day or (equivalent to 1000mcg BDP/day) Seretide (or Sirdupla) 250 MDI 1 puff twice a day * (equivalent to 1000mcg BDP/day) *(unlicensed dosage)	Fostair 100/6 MDI or Nexthaler device 2 puffs twice a day or (equivalent to 1000mcg BDP/day) Duoresp Spiromax 320/9 1 puff twice a day (equivalent to 800mcg BDP/day)
Seretide 500 Accuhaler 1 puff twice a day or	Fostair 200/6 MDI or Nexthaler device 2 puffs twice a day or
(equivalent to 2000mcg BDP/day)	(equivalent to 2000mcg BDP/day)
Seretide (or Sirdupla) 250 MDI 2 puffs twice a day	Duoresp Spiromax 320/9 2 puffs twice a day
(equivalent to 2000mcg BDP/day)	(equivalent to 1600mcg BDP/day)

NB: For patients who have been *admitted to hospital with an asthma exacerbation* please consider when switching inhalers that the steroid dose is steroid equivalent. Switching to a combination inhaler at a lower steroid equivalent dose could result in re-admission

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## Inhaler Switch options for COPD

NON FORMULARY (or <u>not</u> preferred)	FORMULARY (preferred)
Seretide 500 Accuhaler <i>1 puff twice a day or</i> Seretide (or Sirdupla) 250 MDI <i>2 puffs twice a day or</i> Symbicort 400/12 turbohaler <i>1 puff twice a day or</i> Symbicort 200/6 turbohaler <i>2 puffs twice a day *</i>	Fostair 100/6 MDI or Nexthaler device 2 <i>puffs twice a day or</i> Duoresp Spiromax 320/9 <i>1 puff twice a day</i>
*NOTE: Although Symbicort is formulary, it is a 2 <sup>nd</sup> line option and should be reserved as an alternative for patients who cannot tolerate the Duoresp Spiromax device. A switch to Duoresp Spiromax may therefore be considered.	
NOTE: Any other non-formulary inhaler should be switched to one of the formulary preferred options. Ensure prescribed dose is licensed for COPD (even if the dose is <u>not</u> steroid equivalent)
