Re: Non-medical prescribing - validation and annual declaration administration

Following the work done over the last two financial years to validate non-medical prescribers in Lancashire and to collect annual declarations, we are now initiating the process for the current financial year within your CCG.

Please find attached three documents:

- An appendix 1 form (Practice non-medical prescribers*)
- A non-medical prescriber Annual Declaration form
- A non-medical prescriber Register Application form.

It is essential that the forms are completed and returned as detailed below. Failure to return the required forms will result in the non-medical prescribers being removed from the register and therefore unable to prescribe.

1. Appendix 1 Form

This form lists the current non-medical prescribers linked to your practice on epact.net. Please complete this form and record any non-medical prescribers in the bottom section of the form who are currently prescribing within your practice and who are not included on the list.

2. Annual Declaration Form

All non-medical prescribers listed on the Appendix 1 form must complete and return an Annual Declaration form In addition the following must also be attached:

- Prescriber Qualification Certificate
- NMC Statement of Entry or proof of current registration

3. Non-medical prescriber Register Application Form

This must be completed by all non-medical prescribers <u>not</u> listed on the Appendix 1 form. In addition the following must also be attached:

- Prescriber Qualification Certificate
- NMC Statement of Entry or proof of current registration
